At the September Somerset Board of Directors meeting, I presented the proposed 2022 budget and recommended that we maintain our current assessment (dues) amount at \$65 a month.

In 2021 we increased the monthly assessment (dues) by \$5 a month to cover the increase costs from Duke Entergy, Teco Gas and areas brought to our attention by county inspections. Additionally, we re-piped the clubhouse and had the interior and exterior of the building painted and purchased two new treadmills for our active community members.

Lately our 35-year-old underground water system has brought its own set of challenges. If necessary, our current reserve levels are ample to cover these additional costs.

By mid-October you will be receiving a copy of the proposed 2022 budget that will be presented at the November Homeowners meeting on November 17 th.

Starting in 2022 Somerset HOA will no longer provide coupon books. A large majority of homeowners pay annually, while some pay quarterly and still others take advantage of autopay through their bank.

For those who depend on the coupon book, a clippable coupon will be in each month's Chatterbox for your use. We will make available a sheet of coupons. Please contact the office if you wish one.

STORMY WEATHER? DRIVE SAFELY

As fall approaches, wet weather may increase, which can make driving on slick, rainy roads treacherous. Follow this AAA-recommended advice for staying safe:

- **Plan ahead.** Check the weather and driving conditions before getting behind the wheel.
- **Be patient.** Traffic will be slower when rain is falling. Add in extra time to reach your destination so you don't have to rush.
- Turn headlights on. This doesn't just help you see the road better-it makes you more visible to other drivers. Don't use emergency flashers or high beams, though.
- Drive slowly. Even at 35 mph, your tires can lose contact with the road, causing your vehicle to start hydroplaning. To stay in control, slow down, avoid sharp turns, and drive in the tracks of vehicles ahead of you.
- **Don't use cruise control.** Cruise control in wet conditions can increase the risk of hydroplaning.
- **Keep a safe distance.** Allow extra space for you to stop if a vehicle ahead of you stops or swerves suddenly. Slow down early before coming to intersections or stop signs.
- Pull over when necessary. If the rain gets so fierce that you can't see ahead of your car, pull off the road and turn on your emergency flashers. Wait for the rain to subside.
- Eliminate distractions. As always, don't text, talk, or do anything that takes your attention from the road.

An increasing number of driveways in Somerset need assistance. The cement on some are over forty (40) years old. Even the last phase of homes built here, have driveways over thirty (30). For humans, not bad, but for cement - not good. Pressure washing no longer works - it still looks

like it needs cleaning. Unfortunately, what it really needs is staining.

Each company (paint) has its own version of concrete stain for driveways. Sherwin Williams has provided the HOA with the names of its products. They are: H&C Heavy Shield Concrete Stain/ Paint or Dura Plate 289 Concrete Stain/Paint.

Please keep in mind all paint companies have their own. The choice is yours. *However - color is important- if your home has brown tones - use a brown stain - if your home has gray tones use a gray stain. If your house has yellow tones or green tones you can use brown OR gray!

Remember it's always best to check with the office and you must fill out an ARC form before proceeding.

Keep in mind - if you receive a C & R Committee letter concerning your driveway, it may now say stain and not pressure wash. Feel free to try pressure washing but in most cases - concrete stain is the answer.

Columbus Day

Columbus Day first became an official state holiday in Colorado in 1906, and became a federal holiday in the United States in 1937, though people have celebrated Columbus's voyage since the colonial period. In 1792, New York City and other U.S. cities celebrated the 300th anniversary of his landing in the New World. President Benjamin Harrison called upon the people of the United States to celebrate Columbus Day on the 400th anniversary of the event. During the four hundredth anniversary in 1892, teachers, preachers, poets and politicians used Columbus Day rituals to teach ideals of patriotism. These patriotic rituals were framed around themes such as support for war, citizenship boundaries, the importance of loyalty to the nation, and celebrating social progress.

Many Italian-Americans observe Columbus Day as a celebration of their heritage, the first occasion being in New York City on October 12, 1866. Columbus Day was first enshrined as a legal holiday in the United States through the



COLUBUS DAY CONTINUED

lobbying of Angelo Noce, a first generation Italian, in Denver. The first statewide Columbus Day holiday was proclaimed by Colorado governor Jesse F. McDonald in 1905, and it was made a statutory holiday in 1907. In April 1934, as a result of lobbying by the Knights of Columbus and New York City Italian leader Generoso Pope, Congress and President Franklin Delano Roosevelt made October 12 a federal holiday under the name Columbus Day.

Since 1970, the holiday has been fixed to the second Monday in October, coincidentally the same day as Thanksgiving in neighboring Canada (which was fixed to that date in 1959). It is generally observed nowadays by banks, the bond market, the U.S. Postal Service, other federal agencies, most state government offices, many businesses, and most school districts. Some businesses and some stock exchanges remain open, also some states and municipalities abstain from observing the holiday. The traditional date of the holiday also adjoins the anniversary of the United States Navy (founded October 13, 1775), and thus both occasions are customarily observed by the Navy (and usually the Marine Corps as well) with either a 72 or 96-hour liberty period.
