A flyer titled "Somerset Fence Proposal", distributed by a Somerset homeowner, on social media and a Fence Installation Company, contains wrong assumptions.

The By-laws and Declarations of Somerset declare treating all homeowners equally. Therefore, if fences are allowed, all homeowners must share these cost increases.

Our lawn mowing service stated that if Somerset allows fences, the labor cost will increase because they must string trim each fence. Higher labor costs = higher dues (assessments).

Your Somerset Board of Directors is not in favor of FENCES IN SOMERSET and the pamphlet being distributed is not sanctioned or approved by our Homeowners Association.

"Dependable Lawn Mowing is 'not' responsible for irrigation heads that are sticking up. All irrigation equipment must be underground. They are 'not' responsible for damages to structures while string trimmed, such as but not limited to the string on trimmer taking off paint of structure walls or posts. They will do so as carefully as possible. All plant material must have a protective ring around it so the trimmer string cannot hit it." If you have any concern please complete a lawn request form that is in the lobby.

Happy 4th of July Everyone!

Our last Board meeting was held Tuesday, May 16, 2023 at Lime Tree Clubhouse. All Board members and Parkview Pointe Member Ernest Jordan Jr. were present. We approved a proposal for necessary irrigation repairs and installation of drip lines for the shrubs in front of our entrance signs, which will prevent future water staining from previously existing sprinkler heads and reduce the frequency of pressure washing. The signs were pressure washed on June 21st and look great. The previous week a crew from the County trimmed all the trees lining the street and in the medians on Orangewood between Gateway and Central Florida Parkway. Trees on Orangewood in the entrance median north of Gateway will be trimmed in mid-July. Areas on either side of Orangewood between the entrance signs and north of the 528 are maintained by a combination of the County, FDOT, and the Expressway Authority, not WHOA. I am working on contacting the right people to get these areas maintained more frequently and around the same time frame as possible for a more uniformly maintained appearance.

Among the topics of discussion at the meeting included the proposed MLB stadium on I-drive and its impact on Williamsburg should it be built next to Aquatica, the rumored extension of Williamsburg Blvd through Shingle Creek and Grand Lakes Resort to John Young Parkway, and the Williamsburg Areawide Study Recommendations Meeting to be held at Freedom High School on Wednesday, May 31, 2023. Treasurer Liz Norfolk and I attended the

meeting, which focused on short-, medium, and long-term recommendations to amend Gateway and Orangewood in 3 phases over the next 5 years to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety and minimize cut through traffic. The format was a 30-minute open house to meet with Commissioner Nicole Wilson and traffic division project managers followed by an hour of presentation and Q&A. Dozens of Williamsburg residents attended and many, including myself, voiced concerns while a project manager took notes. The study recommendations are to be finalized by July. It was also mentioned that the completion date for the new traffic light at Orangewood and Gateway has been extended to September. On the home page you can also subscribe for updates and offer feedback.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday August 15, 2023 at 7:00 pm at the Lime Tree Club, 5303 Gateway Ave. All Williamsburg members are welcome to attend, and as always, it's an honor and a pleasure to serve our community. Thanks for reading.





Welcome to summer. It is going to be a HOT one. The pool is going to be busy so I thought it is a good time to review the most important pool rules.

Pool Hours: 7am to dusk (between about 8pm and 8:30pm this time of year)

Children under 16 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian and no one under 16 in the spa.

Toilet trained children only in pool (no diapers or swimmers allowed). We have 2 baby pools in the screen room for their use. Shower before entering the pool or spa.

No rafts, floats or inflatable toys in the pool. There are pool noodles in the screen room for your use. Please return when done using.

No food or drinks in or around the pool and spa and no smoking or E-cigarettes.

I would also like to remind all homeowners that the clubhouse alarm is armed at 10pm. This means your key fobs will not work until 7am the next morning. If you need to pay your dues please use the mailbox in front of the clubhouse.

Now that it is so hot, many walkers are out early in the morning or later in the evening. Please use our sidewalks and do not walk in the street. Wear light colored clothing and or carry a flashlight. You want to be sure drivers can see you.

Variously known as the Fourth of July and Independence Day, July 4th has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution (1775-83). In June 1776, representatives of the 13 colonies then fighting in the revolutionary struggle weighed a resolution that would declare their independence from Great Britain. On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later its delegates adopted the Declaration of Independence, a

historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 until the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with typical festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.

What is heat stroke?

Heat stroke is a form of hyperthermia (abnormally elevated body temperature) with accompanying physical and neurological symptoms. Unlike heat cramps and heat exhaustion, two less-severe forms of hyperthermia, heat stroke is a true medical emergency that can be fatal if not properly and promptly treated.

The body normally generates heat as a result of metabolism, and the body is usually able to dissipate the heat by either radiation of heat through the skin or by evaporation of sweat. However, in extreme heat, high humidity, or vigorous exertion under the sun, the body may not be able to dissipate the heat and the body temperature rises, sometimes up to 106 degrees Fahrenheit or higher. Another cause of heat stroke is dehydration. A dehydrated person may not be able to sweat fast enough to dissipate heat, which causes the body temperature to rise.

The population most susceptible to heat strokes are infants, the elderly (often with associated heart diseases, lung diseases, kidney diseases, or on certain medications that make them vulnerable to heat strokes), and athletes, or outdoor

workers physically exerting themselves under the sun.

What are heat stroke symptoms?

Symptoms of heat stroke can sometimes mimic those of heart attack or other conditions. Sometimes a person experiences symptoms of heat exhaustion before progressing to heat strokes. Symptoms of heat exhaustion may include nausea, vomiting, fatigue, weakness, headache, muscle cramps and aches, and dizziness. However some individuals can develop symptoms of heat stroke suddenly and rapidly without warning.

Different people may have different symptoms and signs of heat stroke. But common symptoms and signs of heat stroke include:

- high body temperature
- the absence of sweating, with hot red or flushed dry skin
- rapid pulse
- difficulty breathing
- strange behavior
- hallucinations
- confusion
- agitation
- disorientation
- seizure
- coma
