The WHOA Board of Directors wishes everyone a healthy and happy summer season. Here's an update of what's happened since our May article was published.

On Tuesday, May14, 2024, Treasurer Liz Norfolk and I attended a Valencia Water Control District (VWCD) meeting. Agenda items included approving their 2025 Fiscal Year Budget. Their annual ad valorem tax levy per home increased from \$61.52 to \$67.67. Their Annual Landowner's Meeting held Tuesday, June 11, 2024, included reading of various annual reports and tabulation of votes and proxies to re-elect Amanda Whitney to their Board for another 5 years. Meetings are regularly held the second Tuesday of the month at 1:00 pm at Lake Ridge Club, 10630 Larissa St., Orlando. All Williamsburg homeowners are welcome to attend. Our May meeting was held Tuesday, May 14, 2024 at 7:00pm at the Lime Tree Club. All three Board members were present along with Ron Christian and Ernest Jordan Jr. as attendees. I reported that Lime Tree homeowner Mike Crowe joined our trash and solicitation sign pickup crew. Many thanks to all who help me keep our intersections and roadsides clean. I ordered upgrades to the monument sign lighting to address unsightly nighttime shadows on the signs, numerous irrigation repairs, and trimming of all our palm trees between the signs and the traffic light at Gateway Ave. By the time this article publishes, all work will be completed. Many thanks to our vendors for their service. WHOA Treasurer Liz Norfolk reported that all villages except Wingate are paid for the second quarter and that we now have a healthy reserve. Liz recently retired as Treasurer of the Somerset Board. Many thanks for her 7 years of service to her village.

WHOA Secretary and Orange County (OC) Liaison Donna Finklestein reports that she and Orange County worked together to get Verizon's cable spools and debris removed from behind the Lake Ridge entrance sign, Arthur Austin is running against Commissioner Nicole Wilson in November's election, that the median in front of Publix was mowed on June 6th, and a left turn signal is being installed at the light exiting the Publix plaza at Gateway and CFP. Information about joining the WGA:

We have a shot gun start every Wednesday at 730AM at Remington Golf Course, our current course.

TAKE OUT THE TRASH!

- Grass Clippings and Other Yard Debris - Don't blow or hose grass clippings and other yard waste into the street storm water drain. This debris can collect in storm water drains and clog up the whole system. This is one of the main causes of flooding during heavy rain events! This organic yard debris will cause an increase in "organic load" in the water. How? It will start to rot and become a source for bacteria and algae to grow. These organisms will take the oxygen out of the water causing fish kills, and stinky rotting water. The nutrients in the debris will be released in the water and will form food for invasive species to settle and grow.
- Don't throw *cigarette butts* on the street. They will be washed down the storm water drain and end up in lakes, ponds, canals and even the Everglades, where they can cause harm to fish and birds.
- Did you know that every year, many animals get killed because of trash that people throw out of the window of their cars onto streets and roads? Animals think some of this trash is food, trying to get to it they either get killed by choking on the trash, or getting hit by other cars.

WATER

Run your car without water in the radiator, and it will come to a steaming halt. Yet people who

wouldn't dream of letting their cars run dry often walk around without enough water in their own radiators. And because every cell in the body requires fluids to dissolve and transport vitamins, minerals, sugar and other chemicals, not drinking enough water can leave you felling like a rundown Ford.

The average person loses about 2 percent of his body weight (about 1 1/2 quarts of water) in urine, perspiration, and other body fluids every day. To replace these fluids, doctors advise drinking at least eight glasses of water, milk or juice a day. More if you're a large person, over age 55, sick with a cold, or simply active.

To make sure you drink enough, the brain has special sensors in a part of the brain called the thalamus, which monitor blood levels of sodium. When concentrations of sodium rise, it means that water levels are low. The brain then sends a signal in the form of thirst that says it's time to head to the water cooler.

FATIGUE

We think of fatigue as being caused by not getting enough sleep or working too hard. But in many cases, the problem is even more basic: not getting enough water.

Here's what happens. When you don't drink enough, cells throughout your body start getting a little dry. To quench their thirst, they draw water from the most convenient place - the bloodstream. This leaves the blood thick, sludgy, and harder to pump. The extra work involved in pumping the blood can cause energy levels to decline.
