WATER, very interesting!!!

A Mayo Clinic cardiologist determined that heart attacks can be triggered by dehydration. Good Thing To Know. How many folks do you know who say they don't want to drink anything before going to bed because they'll have to get up during the night? Drinking one glass of water before going to bed avoids a stroke or heart attack. Interesting......Something else I didn't know....I asked the doctor why people need to urinate so much at night time.

Answer from Cardiac Doctor: Gravity holds water in the lower part of the body when you are upright (legs swell). When you lie down and the lower body (legs etc.) seeks level with the kidneys, it is then that the kidneys remove the water because it is easier. This helps to flush the toxins out of the body.

Drinking water at a certain time maximizes its effectiveness on the body:

- 2 glasses of water after waking up helps activate internal organs
- 1 glass of water 30 minutes before a meal helps digestion
- 1 glass of water before taking a bath helps lower blood pressure
- 1 glass of water before going to bed helps avoid a stroke or heart attack

Water at bedtime also helps prevent night time leg cramps - leg muscles are seeking hydration when they cramp and wake you up with a Charlie Horse.

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GRASS CUTTING TIPS

The Kindest Cut - Cutting your turf grass "the right way" is very important. Don't cut it too short, but do cut it regularly and be sure to use sharp blades.

Grass Length - Longer grass has more leaf surface to take in more sunlight. This enables it to grow thicker and develop a deeper root system. Longer grass also shades the soil surface keeping it cooler, helping it to retain moisture and making it difficult for weeds to germinate and grow. A lawn's ideal length will vary with the type of grass, but many turf lawn species are healthiest when kept between 2 1/2 and 3 1/2 inches. Don't remove more than 1/3 of the leaf blade at any one time. Scalping is when you cut the grass too short, leaving too little leaf surface, and actually causing more stress on your lawn! Cutting grass with dull blades also causes stress, and stress makes plants more susceptible to pests and diseases.

Frequency - Grass adjusts better to frequent mowing: once or twice a week in the summer when rain is abundant and growth rapid; less frequently in the winter or dry season when rain is scarcer and plant growth naturally slows.

Keep The Clippings - Leaving short clippings on the grass helps your grass, because they re-cycle nitrogen and help prevent evaporation. It also helps the environment as less yard waste will be

sent to landfills. Never hose or rake your lawn clippings into the street and down the drain, or into neighborhood lakes or canals. Why? Your yard waste can clog up your or that of your neighbor drainage system, which can cause flooding. Dumping yard waste can also produce a shock load of organic materials in lakes and canals which can cause fish kills, and algae blooms.
